Pastor's Report, May 2023

We are four weeks past Easter. We've seen the post-resurrection appearances of Jesus, on the road to Emmaus, at the tomb with Mary, in the locked and boarded-up house where the frightened disciples hid from people who wanted to arrest them, and probably execute them too, like Jesus. Even Thomas saw Jesus and he stopped doubting. Finally Jesus appeared by the Sea of Tiberias (also called Sea of Galilee, Lake Tiberias, Sea of Chinnereth and Lake of Gennesaret). Jesus appeared, and appeared, and again appeared. And he continues to appear, visiting each of us daily. I just came from my daughter Annie's 16th birthday party at Raymond and Pam's house in North Haven. Jesus was there. I saw him when Annie and her cousins all together made the love sign with their hands and laughed and asked some of the adults to make that sign and we did, and that made them laugh harder. Jesus was in Janet's fiery voice when I kept asking her what the pink things were on top of Annie's ice cream cake. "You don't like them." She said. Finally I realized they were Peeps from Easter. And she was right — I don't like them. But I said, "Very pretty." I asked my sister-inlaw Natalie, who's always so bubbly and kind and ready to help anybody, I asked her, "Natalie — does anyone ever get angry with you?" And before she could answer, her husband, Chris, said, "Yeah — I do!" We laughed. And Jesus was there.

I said to all the adults gathered there — because the girls had gone outside — "Well — I need to go home now and write this Dome report. Sorry I'll have to miss the cake." I asked Janet to text Annie to see if she and her cousins wanted to come back inside and have cake now, with me, or have it later and they could save me a piece because I had to go soon. She said the girls will have the cake now. They sat down at the table, just the four of them and I was there — I said, "OK — lets sing. Happy birthday...." They said wait, wait for the other people!! The

other adults came in the room. Then we lit the candles and sang and took pictures afterwards, everyone had their phones out taking pictures. John, Janet's younger brother said, "Ray (still healing from his broken knee/leg) wants to be there too. Ray came hobbling into the room with his crutches and we sang again, a second time — we relit the candles and sang again — "Happy birthday...." More pictures, laughter, smiling. Janet cut the ice cream cake and passed out plates. We talked about the

the ice cream cake and passed out plates. We talked about the Quinnipiac hockey team and their recent NCAA victory over Minnesota. Some of the people at the table were at Tampa to see that game. Jesus was at the table with us just like he was at the house at Emmaus. We ate the ice cream cake with the inedible but lovely pink Peeps, and people relived the hockey game, the girls took more pictures and made more hand signs. They took pictures with apps that made people have a lot of big, puffy hair, made us all look like freaks. They think that's so funny. They record everything, take pictures of everything. Jesus got in a few of the pictures. Jesus with the big, puffy, freaking hair.

Just as I got home, Sr. Carolyn called and said she couldn't make it to Centering Prayer tomorrow at Sacred Heart, Caritas Center, for the monthly centering prayer meeting. "Please lead the group," she said. "Make one of your little presentations. Kathy will take care of the reading." "OK," I said, "Please get well quickly." Of course, Jesus was there, listening as we spoke, assuring us that he would be there too, centering with us. Listening to the scripture passage with us. I heard him say, "I'll be there too."

Jesus told Mary and the disciples that he would go ahead of them, he'd meet them in Galilee. He's there -- here -- now, in Galilee, Galilee in North Haven at the birthday party, Galilee in Hamden watching Netflix with loved ones, watching Midsummer Murders. Galilee is everywhere, the heart of the world, the

heart that beats in us. Galilee is everywhere. Jesus goes ahead of us, to Galilee, everywhere, right now. Look. Listen. Here he is. Jesus.
