# Pastor's Report, October 2023

I've been thinking about our Constitution — the Constitution of the United States, and especially, the First Amendment. It needs to be changed. Here's the problem I have with it — mainly, just a part of it, the part that guarantees free speech. We, the people, at least many of us, despite being made in the image of God, are in such a state of spiritual infancy or immaturity that allowing such undeveloped souls freedom of anything is a bad idea. Probably guns also — people who are too angry, too immature, too crazy, should not be allowed guns or any kind of weapon. But this report for October is about the free speech and the problems that's causing. Before going further, remember that the Bible didn't allow this "freedom" — did not consider it a "right" which anyone was allowed to exercise. The ninth commandment prohibits all forms of lying. King Solomon said false witness is among the six things God hates. Jesus said it defiles a person. I'm just realizing, maybe especially since 2016, that lying has become respectable and even encouraged as a winning strategy in business, politics, education — but it hasn't always been so well regarded and protected. Before this is a legal issue, it is religious. One of the holiest documents in human religious and legal history, the Ten Commandments, forbids lying and it offers punishments when people are caught doing it. Why does our Constitution—IN THE FIRST AMENDMENT—not just allow it, but protect people who practice it?

AND — why don't churches from all the denominations say more about this problem — WHY ISN'T THERE MORE OF AN OUTCRY? Or is this just bothering me because OH MY GOD I'm almost seventy and becoming an old man? Do I hate lying now so much because I'm becoming a curmudgeon ("a bad-tempered person, especially an old one")? Probably. Things bother me now more

than they used to. I can't stand it when someone uses the kitchen and doesn't wipe off the counter. And when my dog Gideon, who's cute and lovable, but when he grabs and eats the tissue I just put down on the table, I want to pick him up and body-slam him. Hopefully these emotional hiccups will subside as I acquire more of the Mind of Christ, which by the way I'm telling God to hurry up if he intends me to have this blissful state of equilibrium because TIME IS RUNNING OUT AND SO IS MY PATIENCE!

Anyway, there's a lot more I'd like to say about these things, but it's almost noon now, I have about a hundred things to do before five o'clock and I need to send this report to Nancy before midnight. So for now I will only say that I love you and every day thank God that it was in the divine plan that we spend this part

of our journeys together.


